



13º CQWS – CQ World Scouts - HF - 2015

April, 11 – 12th 2015

Rules

OBJECTIVE

1. The CQWS - CQ World Scouts is an annual activity organized by the Union of Scouts Brazil - UEB and recognized by the World Organization of the Scout Movement - WOSM, aiming to promote the practice of Amateur Radio in Scouting, with the help of the Alumni, clubs and Associations experienced hams, promoting Scouting and preparing our youth for the skillful use of its stations in supporting Scouting activities and Civil Defense.

WHEN

2. The CQWS - CQ World Scouts is held on the 2nd full weekend of April from 16h00 UTC (13h00 GMT) on Saturday until 16h00 UTC (13h00 GMT) on Sunday. In 2014, will be held on 11 and 12 April.

MODE AND BANDS

3. SSB mode, on the bands of 80, 40, 20, 15 and 10 meters.

CATEGORIES

4. The stations should set a category to participate from the following :

4.1. Single operator:

All the work of operation and registration must be performed by one person, one transmitted signal at any time.

4.1.1. Single Operator - Single Band.

The station should only choose a valid band for the contest.

4.1.2. Single Operator - All Bands,

The station can work on all valid for the contest bands.

4.2. Multi Operators:

Several people can operate the station during the Contest, contributing to the final score. Only one transmitted signal at any time.

4.2.1. Multi Operator - All Bands.

The station can work on all valid for the contest bands.

SPECIAL QUALIFIERS

5. Qualifiers the CQWS - CQ World Scouts:

5.1. **WS** - Season of the World Scout Bureau - HB9S (50 points);

5.2. **ON** - Organizing committee of CQWS (45 points);

5.3. **CN** - National coordinators of CQWS (40 points);

5.4. **CR** - Coordinators regional of CQWS (20 points);

5.5. **CE** - Stations Groups Scouts or Gides Scouts; National Scout Associations stations recognized by WOSM (10 points);

5.6. **CH** - Stations unions, clubs or Hams associations: (8 points);

5.7. **HQ** - National Associations recognized by the IARU Amateur (8 points);

5.8. **RE** – Ham Radio Scout (5 points);

5.9. **RA** – Ham Radio (3 points);

Should only be used a qualifier for each station.



EXCHANGE

6. During the contest, participants send the RS signals, followed by a SPECIAL QUALIFIERS, detailed in item 5 of this document.
7. Should be recorded in logs the following information: callsign, frequency, RS signals and special qualifiers (detailed in item 5 of this Regulation).

MULTIPLIERS

8. Should consider the following multipliers:
 - 8.1. Contacts with the same region WAZ, the multiplier is 1.
 - 8.2. Contacts with other regions WAZ, the multiplier is 2.Reference http://www.cq-amateur-radio.com/cq_awards/cq_waz_awards/index_cq_waz_award.html

VALUES OF CONTACTS

9. The calculation of points of the season will be as follows:
 - 9.1. The points for each contact is the result of the multiplication of points of SPECIAL QUALIFIERS x MULTIPLIER
 - 9.2. The final score of the season will be the sum of all points of contact;
 - 9.3. Only be validated contacts confirmed in the logs of both stations.

10. All logs must be submitted by the April 30 immediately after the contest in Cabrillo 3.0. format.
11. The Union of Scouts Brazil grant diplomas and non-cumulative distinctions:
 - 11.1. Diploma of Participation to stations send their logs (after results);
 - 11.2. Plates or frames relevant interests indicated by the organizing committee of the competition.

DECLARATION

12. By submitting your participation logs for CQWS - World Scouts CQ Contest, you agree that:
 - 12.1. You've read, understood and agree to the contest rules;
 - 12.2. You are in accordance with these rules and with the legislation of the Amateur Radio service of your country;
 - 12.3. The informations contained in the log have been made in accordance with the rules;
 - 12.4. The logs, containing the records of the contacts from the station, may be published and made public;
 - 12.5. All actions and decisions of the Organization CQWS - CQ World Scouts, will be final and shall be binding.

COMMENTS

13. The Organization is not responsible for determining Logs in disagree with this Regulation;
14. To participants are allowed the use of Clusters and Spots, not being self-spot;
15. Scouts from Brazil thanks the participation and collaboration of all in this global activity.
